12.2 DRESS CODE

Employees should wear appropriate attire for their position with the Company in accordance with the following guidelines:

12.2.1 Maintenance personnel shall be clean and neat in appearance. The employees may wear slacks, blue jeans or appropriate pants. Shirts shall be clean and without excessive wrinkles. No maintenance personnel may wear sandals. Employees that are issued uniforms shall adhere to the uniform agreement for maintenance personnel.

Business casual. On Friday's staff can wear jeans. Maintenance wears jeans or work pants.

My one maintenance man does have a dress code, he wears a white shirt and jeans and we get them from Unifirst

business casual during the week and jeans and company shirt are allowed on Fridays. Nothing above the knee.

Just that they be clean & neat no revealing clothing and no short shorts.

APPEARANCE (in employee handbook)

PERSONAL ATTIRE & APPEARANCE

All employees are expected to dress in an appropriate and professional manner and conform to acceptable standards of appearance, cleanliness and hygiene. In general,

clothing should be neat, clean and fit properly. Examples of inappropriate attire include but are not limited to: sweat-suits; ripped or torn jeans and cut-offs; tank tops, halter tops and spaghetti strap tops; clothing with profane or other unacceptable writing or imagery; midriff-bearing shirts; short skirts; clothing that is oversized, revealing, or excessively tight; and athletic and sleep attire.

Casual attire is permitted on Fridays. Clean, pressed jeans (no holes or rips) and sneakers or tennis shoes are permitted only on Fridays. Employees inappropriately dressed may be sent home without pay for the failure to dress appropriately. Employees who are unsure about what constitutes acceptable attire should ask their supervisor or Human Resources.

A. Dress Code Policy

As a representative of the _____, an employee's appearance is a direct reflection on the level of professionalism at the Housing Authority. For this reason, all employees shall follow these basic guidelines in regard to dress and personal appearance.

Employees in the management and administrative offices must dress in a manner that is in keeping with accepted standards of professional office attire. For men, long or short sleeve dress shirts and slacks or dress pants should be worn. For women, dresses, skirts, suits, or dress slacks should be worn.

Types of clothing that would not be considered appropriate for management or administrative personnel are t-shirts, tennis shoes, sweat clothes, blue jeans, or other clothing that may be too casual or revealing for a professional office environment as decided by the Executive Director.

Employees in the maintenance areas must wear appropriate clothing that is suited to the job and which provides adequate protection. Blue jeans, work pants, and work boots are acceptable. Long hair, jewelry, and anything that may be a hazard cannot be worn while on the job.
