Do you have a "laundry facility usage" policy?

Denison - Have a laundry room on site for residents only. It is open 8:00 a.m. till 4:30 p.m. – closed on days office is closed. Residents come to office and purchase a "token" for \$1.00 per washer or dryer. Laundry detergent, etc. is available in a machine in the laundry room. Machines and supplies are maintained by the company who own them. That company keeps 52% of the income and the Authority gets 48% from the use of the machines.

Omaha - Have a laundry facility usage policy and have it posted in laundries (2). I give it to tenant at time of move-in. I go over it at time of move in and give them a copy w/ their signature acknowledging same. I do not give them the lock ID until they call for it and I keep a list of those who do use it. They are responsible for helping to keep the laundries clean or it will be shut down.

Nacogdoches - We have some rules that we issue to each resident but do not have an adopted policy.

Tatum - policy is attached

Bridgeport - Sign in laundry explaining rules and tenant has to sign a usage agreement when given a key

Dayton - We do not have a policy, but we do have laundry facilities and they have to get a key to use it. In the past, we would leave them open and there would be damage or people would be having sex in them, so we started locking them.

Seguin - We have laundry rooms for the elderly sites only. No specific policy other than clean up after yourself.

Paris - have had a concealed carry permit for the past 18 years. I keep a firearm in my office, and vehicle. Occasionally I will carry it when on the property at night.
